

The Hammock House offers all school-age children within the Middle Florida Keys

FREE after-school and camp programs.



The Highland Athletic Games – the original "Strongman" sport – have a history dating back thousands of years. Their exact origins are lost in the mists of history, but they still reflect the rugged nature of the Highlanders who invented them. The games may have evolved from a need to train for hand-to-hand combat, or to determine the most battle-

worthy warriors. Today they are tests of strength in which honor and sportsmanship are valued as much or more than winning.

Feats like tossing tree trunks, throwing bundles of straw over a bar and launching heavy rocks as far as possible are thrilling to witness, but because they require stamina and strength, they were traditionally considered unsuitable for women. The Florida Keys Celtic Festival is a leader in the charge for female participation. In its inaugural year (2014) the festival featured the world's first all-female games.

"At the time when I started the athletics competition at the Keys festival, there were still a lot of games either not offering, or limiting, the number of spaces for women competitors," said Keys Celtic Athletic Coordinator Bob Gourlay. "Because we focus only on women, we attract athletes from all over the U.S. and Canada. ... With all the games I do, this one is still the most fun."

Echoing Gourlay's sentiment is three-time Keys athlete Laura Anthony. "(The Celtic Festival is) my favorite game because the spectators are just fantastic," she said. "I love the access they have to the athletes and how involved they get with us."

Katie Tennant is a record holder in the Braemar Stone event, one of the first U.S. women to compete in Scotland's prestigious Braemar Gathering, and a participant in the popular TV series "American Ninja Warrior."

"The Highland Games community is great because it's a group of strong women empowering other women," she said. "Athletes are super helpful, encouraging and supportive of one another." Tennant, along with Anthony, are among the Highland Games contestants scheduled for the 2024 Florida Keys Celtic Festival.

## THIS YEAR'S EVENTS INCLUDE:

**Caber Toss**: Participants must pick up the tapered end of the caber (a 13- to 15-foot "tree trunk"), balance it, then toss it so that the upper end hits the ground and turns completely over. Success is gauged by how closely the caber falls to the 12 o'clock position.


**Braemar Stone:** Named for the ancient festival held in Braemar, Scotland. Similar to the Olympic shot put, using a large 13- to 18-pound stone instead of a steel ball.


**Hammer Throw**: The Scottish Hammer Throw is another event that has a counterpart in the Olympics. Each participant gets three throws with a 12-pound hammer.

**Sheaf Toss**: The "sheaf" is actually a bag full of straw, weighing about 12 pounds. Competitors use a pitchfork to toss the sheaf behind them and over a crossbar. For those successful in clearing each height, the bar is raised.

**Weight Over Bar**: Like the Sheaf Toss, contestants have three chances to clear a crossbar with a 21- or 28-pound weight.

**Weight for Distance**: There are two events, contested separately – one with a "light weight" (14 pounds) and one with a "heavy weight" (20-28 pounds). The athlete must throw the weight, using one hand, for distance.

The Hammock House Just for Fun Summer Camp offers four weeks of exciting free experiences which include recreation, two healthy snacks, lunch, arts and crafts, field trips, science experiments and music.

The Hammock House offers free camp during school breaks, spring break, Thanksgiving and Christmas break. Camps are open 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and provide holiday fun and games while giving working parents an important opportunity to keep working through the holidays.

# **Enrichment Programs**

Students engage in activities to help develop compassion and contribute to the community. They include yoga, gym, ukulele lessons, Mutt-i-grees, Marathon Yacht Club sailing and more.

# SARA'S STORY From Student to Counselor

It seems almost impossible to describe what the Hammock House has done for me throughout the years I have lived in Marathon. My mom found out about St. Columba when she was looking for a place for my brother and me to go during the summer while she was looking for a job.

My mom began to lose hope when no one would take us in. Hope then showed itself in Reverend Debra at St. Columba – she allowed us into her camp even though it was full. I never knew how important that simple act of kindness was to my mom until years later when I learned how it changed her life – and, little did I know, mine as well.

The Hammock House has taught me how to be a good person, how to look at the world in an optimistic way and how to find the good in people. I learned how to have mature conversations with people who were older than me. Most importantly, however, I learned the importance of teamwork and how to be kind and empathetic to others.

Now, I work at the Hammock House as a summer camp counselor, and I get the chance to teach the lessons that were so important to me to the next generation of Hammock House kids.



#### LIEUTENANT COLONEL'S COMPANY OF THE 42ND

The Lieutenant Colonel's Company of the 42nd is a living history group that depicts the regiment's camp life and activities during Florida's British Period of 1763-1783. They showcase military life, weapons, clothing and the experiences of wives who traveled with the army.

The 42nd has a history in the Americas, including playing a major role in the English conquest of Cuba and protecting the American frontier. During the American Rebellion, they participated in several campaigns, and some records report they were quartered in St. Augustine, East Florida, before being assigned to the Bahamas.

Come visit and witness their daily routine – from sleeping to eating and everything in between. Plus, join in on some exciting activities while you're here.

# MARY, QUEEN OF SCOTS

Mudlark Living History proudly brings to you Mary, Queen of Scots. Join her as she strolls through the festival lanes, takes tea at the lovely tea room and cheers on the athletes.

Find her in the 42nd Highland Regiment's historical encampment for a meet and greet, and take your portrait with the most beloved queen of Scotland.

#### RAPTORS OF THE ROUND TABLE

Raptors of the Round Table are dedicated to the preservation and appreciation of birds of prey. As licensed master falconers, they hold both state and federal permits for the possession of raptors and have over 30 years of experience working with these magnificent birds. Their mission is to educate the public about the rich history of falconry, with a focus on the care, welfare and training of raptorial species.

They also advocate for the conservation of birds of prey as a vital part of nature and wildlife conservation programs and encourage the maintenance of falconry as a legal field sport. By continuing the traditions of falconry, they can help to ensure the welfare of both the sport and the raptors it employs. It's important to note that possessing any raptor without the proper permits can lead to fines or even jail time.

#### **CROSSROADS IRISH SET & CEILI DANCERS**



# **CUE THE MUSIC**

The festival is proud to bring three internationally-celebrated Celtic musical acts, and three Florida-based groups, to the Middle Keys.

# **ALBANNACH**

From Scotland comes Albannach, one of the original performers from the very first Florida Keys Celtic Festival. "Albannach" - Scots Gaelic for "Scottish" - begins its 20th year of bringing the ancient tribal sounds of Scotland to festivals and Highland games across North America and Europe. Their unique musical blend of drums, bagpipes and digeridoo is soul-stirring and danceable. Their vocals, some of which are sung in Scots Gaelic, are haunting and beautiful.

Albannach has earned a mighty following, dubbed "Nach Nation," because of their cross-cultural appeal to young and old alike.

#### THE SCREAMING ORPHANS

From Ireland are the Screaming Orphans, sisters who have been singing together practically since infancy. In their teens they formed their own Celtic pop/rock band and named themselves the Screaming Orphans – despite the fact that they do not scream, nor are they orphans.

After being "discovered" by the late Sinéad O'Connor and eventually touring with her, they went on to tour and record with other renowned musicians. But the Screaming Orphans shine brightest when performing their own music: a blend of original compositions of melodic oldschool pop and contemporary takes on traditional Irish music and song. Praised for their sibling harmonies, they've taken several of their self-produced recordings all the way to the top of the iTunes charts.

# THE BYRNE BROTHERS

The Byrne Brothers first captivated the world through viral videos of three young lads, accompanied by their father, playing music in the streets of Ireland. Walt Disney World took notice, inviting them to perform at Raglan Road Pub and become the youngest ever cast members in Disney World history.

Now teens, the brothers have won numerous championships playing their respective instruments and in Irish dancing. They were named Rising Stars of the Year 2021, later to win the 2022 Young Artist Academy Award for Outstanding Music Ensemble. Now Florida residents, they tour extensively across the U.S., making their mark on the Irish music scene with electrifying and high-energy performances that showcase traditional Irish music and worldclass Irish dancing.

#### **WEST OF GALWAY**

West of Galway, based in Naples, has been entertaining Irish and Celtic music-loving crowds since 2003. The band members are friends who met through music and the shared experience of growing up with Saturday night kitchen parties with families and friends. That tradition of music, family, and friends - ceol, teaghlach, agus cairde – is observed throughout the Irish diaspora, and West of Galway, winner of the 2010 International Battle of the Bands Competition, brings that tradition to pubs. concerts, and festivals up and down the U.S. eastern seaboard.




# THE POLICE PIPE AND DRUMS CORPS OF FLORIDA

Police Pipe and Drum Corps of Florida was founded in 1990. Based in Fort Lauderdale, the band and color guard are composed of 51 serving and retired police officers, firefighters and civilians, all of whom are volunteers. # DRAKE SCHOOL OF IRISH DANCE

The Drake School of Irish Dance, founded in 1990 by Dublin, Ireland native Karl Drake, is one of the most prestigious Irish dance schools in the South. Drake Irish Dance of South Florida is led by Christina Deacy, herself once a Drake student who won the 2011 Southern Regional Championships and later earned a 16thplace finish at nationals and 36th place at worlds. Drake Irish Dancers have created a legacy of competitive achievements. Their performances are an exciting blend of talent, joy and enthusiasm.


